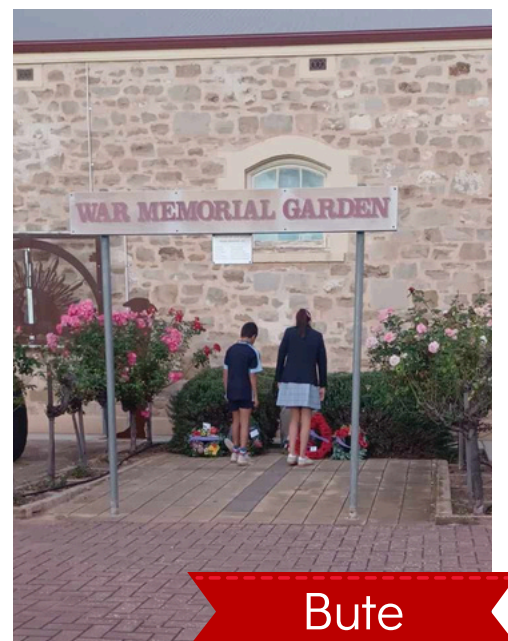

Year 12 History Camp – Melbourne 2026

During the holidays, our Year 12 History students travelled to Melbourne for an exciting and memorable History Camp filled with learning, reflection, and new experiences.

Throughout the week, students explored many of Melbourne's iconic locations, including Federation Square, the National Gallery of Victoria, Queen Victoria Market, the State Library of Victoria, Cook's Cottage, the Melbourne Museum, and the Old Melbourne Gaol. They also attended the opening game of the AFL ANZAC Round at Marvel Stadium and experienced navigating Melbourne's public transport system independently.

A particularly moving aspect of the camp was the visit to the Melbourne Holocaust Museum, where students participated in learning activities and heard testimony from Holocaust survivor Sarah Saaroni OAM. Students also spent time at the Shrine of Remembrance, reflecting on the service and sacrifice of Australian men and women during wartime.

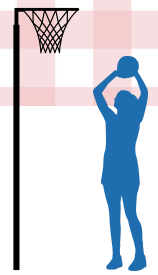

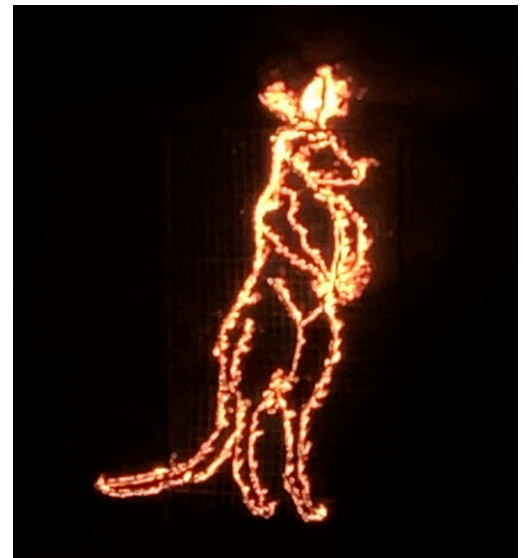

Agriculture Curriculum

The Ag block has recently welcomed some new residents with three cattle, eight goats and twelve sheep arriving late last term. All animals have settled in well after being inducted by senior Ag classes. They conducted a vaccination program and recorded weights for all animals to allow weight tracking throughout their time at school.

Year 11 and 12 students have also spent some time earlier this term sowing the school's vetch crop. They each took turns operating the tractor and seeder to plant one paddock. For many this was their first experience driving a tractor, but all students took on the challenge and did their part to contribute to the school cropping program.

Year 10 students have begun their sheep production unit and are working towards skills in condition scoring, fat scoring, and general animal handling, whilst tracking weight gain and contributing to animal management decisions.

Year 9 students have completed a plant investigation where they worked in small groups to test various factors of plant growth. They have now moved into their animal systems unit and will work primarily with the goats to practice their animal handling skills and learn about general livestock production.
